½ yard	Chili Peppers - Tan (A)	9380-44
¼ yard	Food - Black (B)	9374-99
⅛ yard	Urban Legend - Red (C)	7101-88
½ yard	Serape Stripe - Green/Multi (D)	9377-66
¼ yard	Pinatas - Black (E)	9379-99

Apron Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Chili Peppers - Tan (A), cut:

- Cut (1) 13 ½" x 42" WOF strip.

From the Food - Black (B), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 4" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Urban Legend - Red (C), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 5 ½" strips.

From the Serape Stripe - Green/Multi (D), cut:

- (2) 6" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (1) 6" x 74" strip.

From the Pinatas - Black (E), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x 42" WOF strip.

Apron Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 42" Fabric E strip to the bottom of (1) 13 ½" x 42" Fabric A strip to make the apron body (Fig. 1).

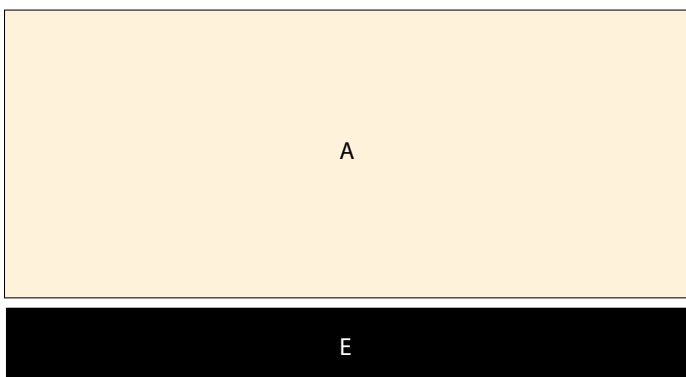

2. Fold under each side and the bottom edge ¼" and then a second ¼" and press. Topstitch the folded edges to create a finished edge along the both sides and across the bottom of the apron.

3. Using a gather stitch, sew across the top edge of the apron body. Gather the top edge to the desired width and fullness.

4. To make the apron tie unit, fold (1) 6" x 74" Fabric B strip in half lengthwise and press (Fig. 2). Open the folded fabric and fold each long edge to the creased centerline and press (Fig. 3).

5. Fold the pressed fabric in half again and press to make (1) 2" x 74" apron tie strip (Fig. 4).

6. Fold in each short end of the apron tie ¼" and press.

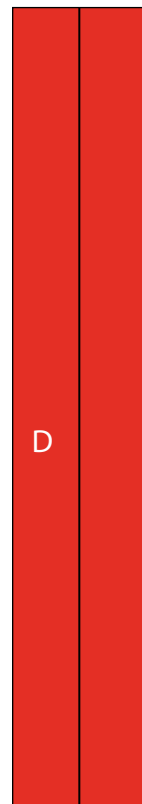

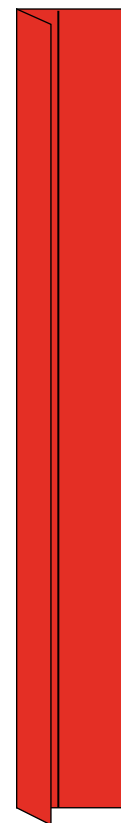

7. Measure and mark the center point on the apron tie and the center point on the top of the gathered apron body. Slide the apron body inside the folded apron tie, butt up the edge of the apron body to the folded edge of the tie. Pin the two pieces together (Fig. 5).

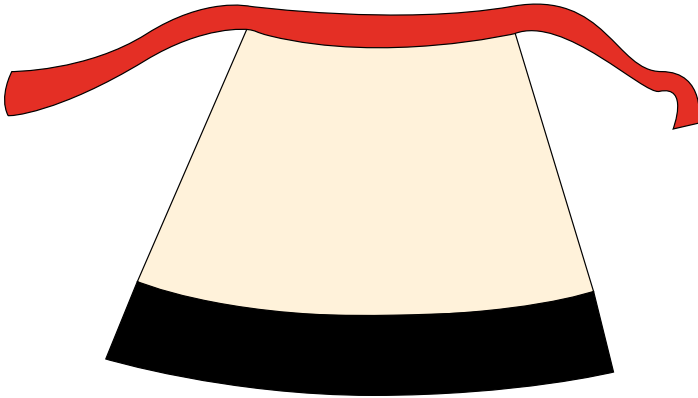

8. Starting at one end of the tie, topstitch down one short side of the tie and then along the long edge of the tie and then up the second short side of the tie, to finish the tie edges and to sew the tie to the apron body.

9. Sew (1) 2" x 5 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top of (1) 4" x 5 1/2" Fabric B strip to make one pocket (Fig. 6). Repeat to make a second pocket.

10. Fold under each side of (1) pocket a 1/4" and then a second 1/4" and press. Top stitch across the top of the pocket only. Repeat with the second pocket.

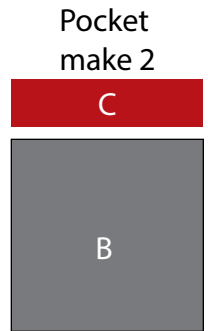

11. Position each pocket onto the front of the apron as desired. Pin in place. Topstitch down each side and across the bottom of each pocket to attach them to the apron body (Fig. 7).

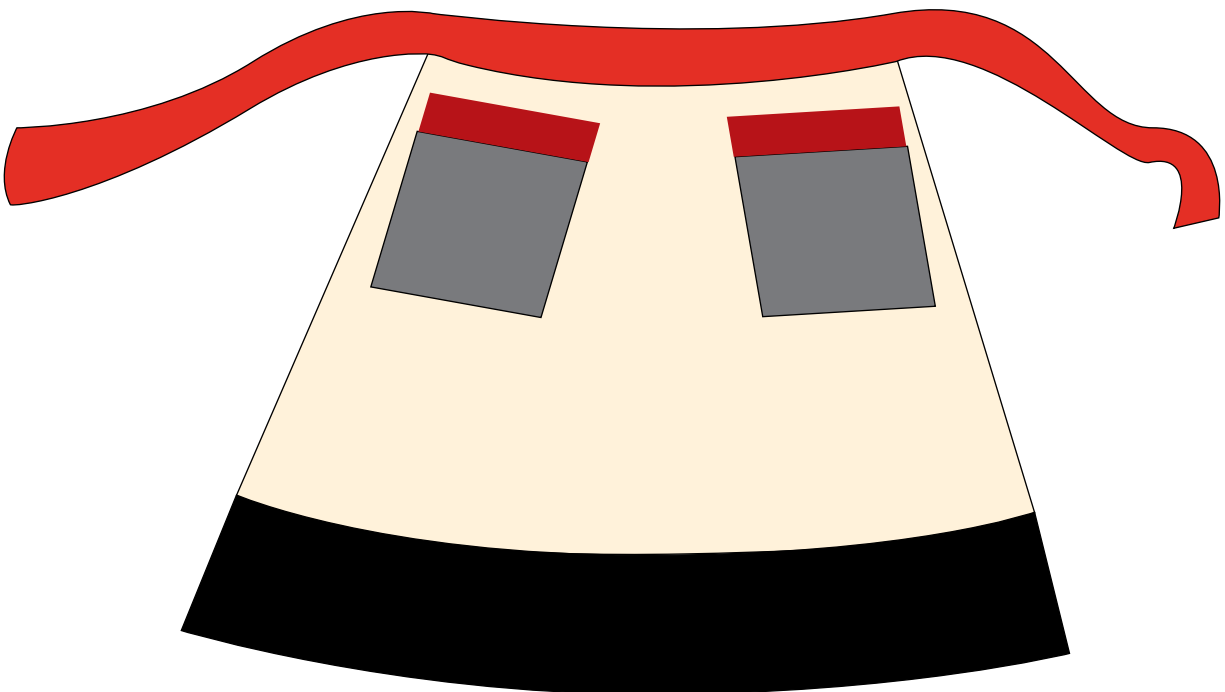
